
Why would I want to Participate in the Family Leadership Training Program?

The Family Leadership Training Program will build your knowledge and skills and help you advocate more effectively for your child and family. Also, family leaders can assist a deaf-blind project by increasing the awareness of deaf-blindness; supporting other families and helping develop effective programs, services and legislation.

Selection for participation will be based on the participant's:

- Interest and enthusiasm for participating in the training
- Ability to commit to attending faceto-face training sessions held between November 2008 and September 2009
- Ability to commit to 6-7 one-hour conference calls between November 2008 and September 2009
- Ability to commit to setting and working on a leadership goal during the 12 month period

NCDB Family Leadership Training Program

About the Training Program

NCDB provides an intensive one-year family leadership training program in I- 3 states each year. Six to ten participants are selected to participate in each state. The goal of the program is to train and support family members of children who are deaf-blind to become leaders within deaf-blindness in their local or state communities. During the program, family members identify and pursue meaningful leadership roles based on their interests and strengths. Examples include the following:

- Mentoring and supporting other families
- Serving on advisory committees or boards
- Increasing awareness of deaf-blindness by telling their story to the media
- Providing activities for sibling groups
- Providing training to families and professionals

A core training curriculum, which will be customized to fit the needs of the participants, will be used for the training.
